Sub- Recommendations of the Inquiry Committee

Sir,

I am directed to state that the National Commission for Women (NCW) has taken suo motu cognizance and constituted an Inquiry Committee under Section 8(1), read with Section 10(1) and (4) of the NCW Act, 1990 to inquire into the complaint regarding harassment/ torture and implication in false cases by an ex teacher of an educational institution of U.P.

After looking into the facts and circumstances of the present case, the Commission strongly recommends the following:-

1. Sometimes girl students may succumb to depression due to life style changes in the younger generation and the increasing generation gap, it is, therefore, recommended that if there is any such sign, they must be provided clinical care.
2. The school authorities should organize counseling session for the students so that their stress level can be minimized and they may share their feelings with their family members or teachers so that they may not take the extreme step of committing suicide.
3. Family member should treat their child with friendly attitude so that they can share everything with parents.
4. Parents and the teachers should observe the activities of their children/ students and provide them support as and when required, so that they may not take such an extreme step.
5. Police should be vigilant near school and colleges. Lady police officers/ constables should be deployed in civil clothes near girl colleges and should immediately nab such rowdy elements who stalk girls frequently.

6. There should be 24X 7 police helpline (**which should be workable and being answered only by sensitive female officers who gives patient hearing to the callers**).
7. School / college authorities should organize counseling for the parents in order to bridge the generational attitudinal gap which is alarmingly increasing in small towns/ cities due to modern means of telecommunication and internet.

I am directed to communicate that the State Government is requested to kindly take appropriate action in the matter and kindly intimate the Commission about action taken expeditiously.
